GUEST ARTIST BIO



Julianne received her musical training at Eastman School of Music where she studied with Armand Basile, completing her work with him at the University of Wisconsin/ Milwaukee. On her return to Grand Valley State University, she served as Chair of the music department until 1996. Meantime, the university acquired two carillons and she was off to the Netherlands Carillon School where she earned a diploma in carillon, performance and literature. On her return to GVSU, she nurtured the study of carillon and established the summer carillon series concert series

which flourished for 25 years. She served MSU as interim carillonneur during the search to fill the vacancy left by the death of Ray McClellan. She is a member of the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America and has served on the board, as an adjudicator, and as President. She also gives regular guest recitals, most recently performing the rededication concert of the Netherlands Carillon in Arlington National Cemetery in Washington, DC, originally given to the US by the Dutch government in thanks for aid during WWII, and recently expanded with 3 new bells.
